On March 1, 1892, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Silver Grove unanimously passed a resolution extending the town boundaries. The following plats were added: plat # 348 known as the Martha E. Jackson Plat, and plats # 343 and #344 each known as the Korb's Plat. Each of these plats has already had lots laid off. These plats are in addition to the already four plats of The Town of Silver Grove. The original plats are #'s 323, 327, 330 and 332. Where are these plats?
